O God, you know us to be set in the midst of so many and great dangers, that by reason of the frailty of our nature we cannot always stand upright: grant to us such strength and protection as may support us in all dangers and carry us through all temptations; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen**.

Why have we fasted, +they say, %and you have not seen it? Why have we humbled ourselves, and you have not noticed?+ right et an the day of your fasting, you do as you please and exploit all your workers. Your fasting ends in quarrelling and strife, and in striking each other with wicked fists. You cannot fast as you do today and expect your voice to be heard on high. Is this the kind of fast I have chosen, only a day for people to humble themselves? Is it only for bowing one as head like a reed and for lying in sackcloth and ashes? Is that what you call a fast, a day acceptable to the Lord? ±s not this the kind of fasting I have chosen: to loose the chains of injustice and untie the cords of the yoke, to set the oppressed free and break every yoke? Is it not to share your food with the hungry and to provide the poor wanderer with shelter. when you see the naked, to clothe them, and not to turn away from your own flesh and blood? Then your light will break forth like the dawn, and your healing will quickly appearL then your righteousness will go before you, and the glory of the Lord will be your rear guard. Then you will call, and the Lord will answerLyou will cry for help, and he will say: here am I.

Listen to the Gospel of Christ according to Matthew Glory to you, O Lord
