Collect

Most merciful God, who by the death and resurrection of your Son Jesus Christ delivered and saved the world: grant that by faith in him who suffered on the cross we may triumph in the power of his victory; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen**

The first reading is from the Book of Ezekiel

The hand of the Lord was on me, and he brought me out by the Spirit of the Lord and set me in the middle of a valley; it was full of bones. He led me back and forth among them, and I saw a great many bones on the floor of the valley, bones that were very dry. He asked me, Son of man, can these bones live?+I said, Sovereign Lord, you alone know.+

Then he said to me, % Rrophesy to these bones and say to them, Dry bones, hear the word of the Lord! This is what the Sovereign Lord says to these bones: I will make breath enter you, and you will come to life. I will attach tendons to you and make flesh come upon you and cover you with skin; I will put breath in you, and you will come to life. Then you will know that I am the Lord. So I prophesied as I was commanded. And as I was prophesying, there was a noise, a rattling sound, and the bones came together, bone to bone. I looked, and tendons and flesh appeared on them and skin covered them, but there was no breath in them.

Then he said to me, % Rrophesy to the breath; prophesy, son of man, and say to it, I his is what the Sovereign Lord says: Come, breath, from the four winds and breathe into these slain, that they may live. A So I prophesied as he commanded me, and breath entered them; they came to life and stood up on their feet. a vast

army. Then he said to me: Son of man, these bones are the people of Israel. They say, Dur bones are dried up and our hope is gone; we are cut off.qTherefore prophesy and say to them: This is what the Sovereign Lord says: My people, I am going to open your graves and bring you up from them; I will bring you back to the land of Israel. Then you, my people, will know that I am the Lord, when I open your graves and bring you up from them. I will put my Spirit in you and you will live, and I will settle you in your own land. Then you will know that I the Lord have spoken, and I have done it, declares the Lord.

NEW CHURCH HALL: After the vestry meeting at 6.30pm on 9^{th} April, we will be welcoming architect Dr Ed Green, who will be presenting the plans for our new church hall. It has been a long journey coming to this place and we, on the committee, are very excited by the design. You might recall that we had such a meeting about 2 years ago, but much has changed since then and we went back to the drawing board. The original plan was going to cost around £500,000 plus VAT. This new plan is likely to cost in the region of £300,000 and will not incur VAT due to the fact that it doesn't join the church. It's still a lot of money and we're hoping to sell a strip of land alongside the

houses to the north of the car park to facilitate the cost. Please try and come as we need your support and endorsement or otherwise. Linda Alexander, Chair of New Hall Committee
