#### Collect

Almighty God, in Christ you make all things new: transform the poverty of our nature by the riches of your grace, and in the renewal of our lives make known your heavenly glory; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen** 

### The first reading is from the Book of Samuel

The boy Samuel ministered before the Lord under Eli. In those days the word of the Lord was rare; there were not many visions.

One night Eli, whose eyes were becoming so weak that he could barely see, was lying down in his usual place. The lamp of God had not yet gone out, and Samuel was lying down in the house of the Lord, where the ark of God was. Then the Lord called Samuel.

Samuel answered, Here I am.qAnd he ran to Eli and said, Here I am; you called me.qBut Eli said, did not call; go back and lie down.qSo he went and lay down. Again the Lord called, Samuel!qAnd Samuel got up and went to Eli and said, Here I am; you called me.q

My son, qEli said, ± did not call; go back and lie down.q

Now Samuel did not yet know the Lord: the word of the Lord had not yet been revealed to him.

A third time the Lord called, Samuel!qAnd Samuel got up and went to Eli and said, Here I am; you called me.q

Then Eli realised that the Lord was calling the boy. So Eli told Samuel, Go and lie down, and if he calls you, say, Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening. QSo Samuel went and lay down in his place. The Lord came and stood there, calling as at the other times, Samuel! Samuel!


