


Station 1:

Jesus' birth prophesised

What is the background to Jesus' birth? The Jewish people had awaited the arrival of the Messiah – a Saviour who would bring freedom and peace - for centuries and with great expectancy. This arrival was prophesised many times in the Old Testament part of the Bible (some scholars suggesting on over 300 occasions), written hundreds of years before Jesus' birth with some prophesies shown here:

Station 2:

"The angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to visit a virgin called Mary, engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. And he came to her and said, "Greetings, favoured one! The Lord is with you." But she was much perplexed by his words and pondered what sort of greeting this might be.

The angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favour with God. And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. Mary said to the angel, how can this be, since I am a virgin?" The angel said to her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the Power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be holy; he will be called the Son of God. And now your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son; and this is the sixth month for her who was said to be barren. For nothing will be impossible with God. Then Mary said, "Here I am, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word." Then the angel departed from her."

And why this has happened to me, that the mother of my Lord comes to me? For as soon as I heard the sound of your greeting, the child in my womb leapt for joy. And blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfilment of what was spoken to her by the Lord".

Station 4:

Joseph's Dream

"When his mother Mary had been engaged to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. Her husband Joseph, being a righteous man and unwilling to expose her to public disgrace, planned to dismiss her quietly. But just when he resolved to do this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins. When Joseph awoke from the sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him; he took her as his wife but had no marital relations with her until she had borne a son; and he named him Jesus."



Station 7:

The visit of the Shepherds

"In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them "Do not be afraid; for see – I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the City of David a Saviour, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger". And suddenly there was with the Angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favours". When the angels had left them and gone to into heaven, the shepherds said to one another "Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us"."

Station 8:

Wise Men visit

The three astrologers go to Bethlehem, the star they've been tracking from the East stops, right over where the baby Jesus lays. They kneel, awestruck by him.
